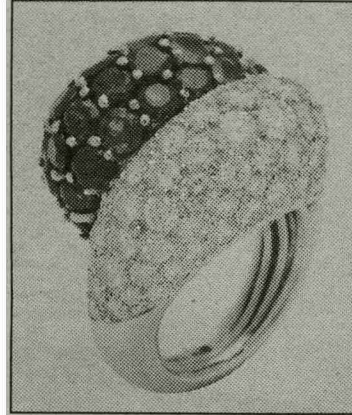

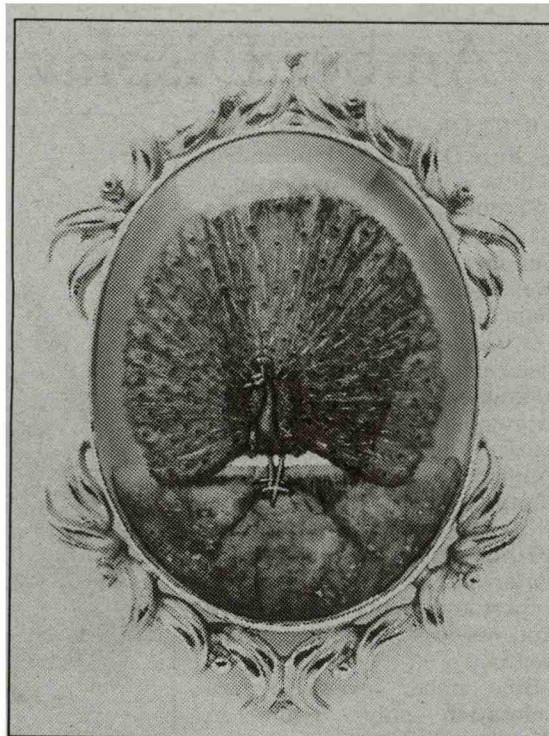
Show, there’s such a wide variety of clientele from all around the world — I take all my merchandise,” said Dealer Ken Leach of Gallery 47.

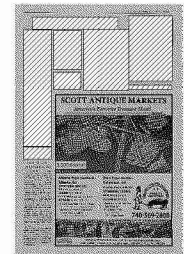

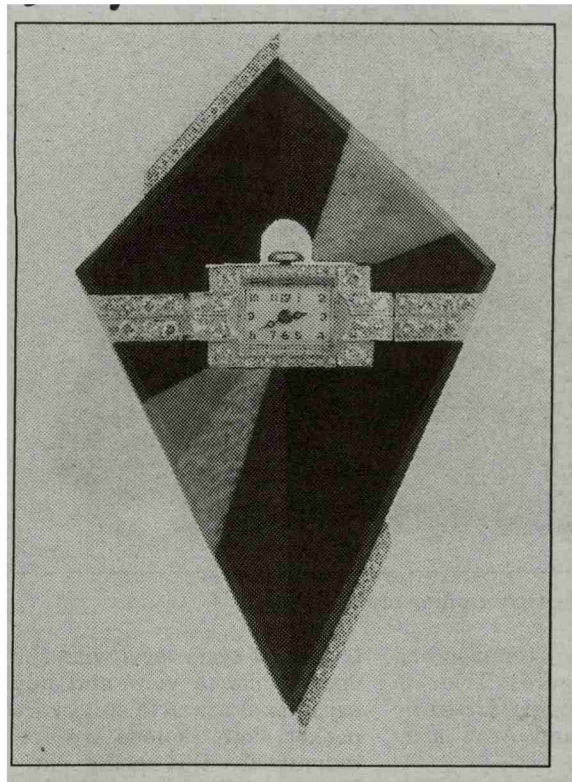


A ruby and diamond bypass ring; Pat Saling, Booth No. 4002.
